Adjusting the ISRI seat

Prolonged sitting with bad posture in a poor seat can have painful consequences on the spine. Recent research has found that people who drive vehicles for more than four hours a day are six times more likely to take time off work for back trouble than those who drive for less. This is because, in most cases, the driver either has bad posture or the seat he is using, is not ergonomically sound.

As mining operators spend many hours in their vehicles, it is imperative that they are seated as comfortably and ergonomically as possible during this time. With this in mind, as we have been telling all our customers, the ISRI seat is the most comfortable and ergonomically friendly seat around.

However it's not enough just to get the best seat. You need to know how to set the seat up in its correct configuration to suit you. With this in mind, we have recently developed a training video to make sure you understand what all the knobs and dials on the ISRI 6860/870 does, from adjustments to backrest, height, rake, lumbar support and slide.

We urge you to spend some time familiarising yourself with the various controls of the ISRI 6860/870 to help you stay comfortable and healthy while on the job.
